MEMBERSHIP

It's the time of year when I begin to get on people's nerves. But do I care? Yes I do, but unfortunately it's my job to be really irritating. So just to remind you of the membership fees:

DAILY MEMBER

Joining fee £20.00 for the year, commencing April 1st.

£3.00 green fee every time you play, whether it be a roll-up, an in-house competition or a league match.

£2.00 to enter any in house competition (£2.00 per competition)

FULL MEMBER

Joining fee £20.00 for the year, commencing April 1st

Plus £50.00 green fee (payable at time of joining) which covers all roll-ups, competitions and home matches. £3.00 if playing away in league match

£2.00 to enter any in house competition (£2.00 per competition).

JUNIORS

Junior (16 and under) membership is free, we simply ask for £1.00 each time they play

GUESTS

Guests are of course welcome to play as often as they wish, the first visit is free and then the cost is £3.00 every time. Guests are not eligible to enter any competitions.

The season is approximately 20 weeks so if you play just once a week that equates to £60 for the season plus your membership fee of £20.00. Therefore "Full Membership" represents excellent value for money.

All membership fees should be paid before April 1st please. You will find our bank details overleaf.

I travelled the world in the navy for 4½ vears and then left and married Cath.

Within 2 years we had 2 children Tracy and Gary. During this time I was working at Plesseys and Cath had a part time job. Together we bought our first house near Thompson Park. Things were going well for a while but then in 1974 the Prime Minister, Mr Edward Heath, introduced the 3 day week because we needed to save electricity. Things got really tight and we could no longer afford



to pay the mortgage. I saw a shop with a flat above to rent in Chester Road, so we sold the house, within 2 weeks, and moved into the flat and took over the shop. The shop was an off-licence and general store open 7 days a week from 9.00am till 10.00pm. Cath ran the shop as well as looking after 2 young kids. I would go to the cash and carry during my lunch breaks and work in the shop C) It was agreed that the the other 4 days. 3 months later Plesseys returned to full time work. There was such a demand that I was working 7 days a week as foreman of the inspection department. We kept this up for 2 years and then Cath fell for our third child Darren. So we bought our house in Broadmeadows and Cath's parents moved into the flat over the shop.

I then heard of a milk round for sale so I left Plesseys and became a milkman. This was going so well I bought a second round that linked onto mine. Meanwhile Cath was still running the shop. But then people started buying their milk from supermarkets and I was losing 10/15% of my business every year. So the milk rounds were no longer viable. So we had to sell the shop to keep going. Then I took over a shop on a large council estate. A few years later the shop and off-licence next E) It was agreed that clubs to us came up for sale and we bought the business, and joined it on to our shop. We were open 7 days a week from 6.30am to 9.00pm. We turned it into a SPAR shop and installed lottery machines, cash machines etc and luckily it all paid off.

> I sold the business in 2008 aged 68 and bought a caravan. We spent 5 delightful years touring the country. Sadly, Cath passed away in July 2018, but I was lucky to have a very supportive family around me. A chap called Bill Clark asked if I would be interested in bowls so I asked my neighbour and friend Ronnie Watson and we went along to Herrington together. We got hooked. There were only 12 members so we asked everyone we met if they fancied it, one of them was Colin Watson. Ronnie bumped into Barry Thomas at Barnes Park and invited him along too. The rest, as they say, is history.
