£2.00 to enter any in house competition (£2.00 per competition)

FULL MEMBER

£70.00 for the year, includes £20 joining fee. commencing April 1st (payable at time of joining) which covers all roll-ups, competitions and home matches. £3.00 if playing away in league match

£2.00 to enter any in house competition (£2.00 per competition).

The Wick (Or Herrington Glide) we learn a bit about Gary Hassan

I was born in the leafy suburbs of Farringdon council estate, Sunderland. Having six siblings, four sisters and two brothers, kept me busy and entertained throughout my formative years. The best fighter in our family was my sister Carol, not to be messed with especially if she wanted the bathroom before you. My father was employed as a maintenance plumber within Sunderland shipbuilders so we were better off than some. Mam was our full-time nanny, she never managed a day off bless her; she's still going at 84 years of age with her family now taking care of her when we can, sadly we lost Dad last year, God bless him. I loved my time as a kid playing in the parks and countryside which surrounded the Doxford Park estate where I lived and flourished after moving from Farringdon in 1970. No such thing as mobiles or social media back then; street cred was obtained by being recognised as either an expert tree climber, scrapper or good shot with a catapult. We whiled away our childhood playing games in the street, games now long forgotten by many such as kick the tin, tiddlyiego, kerby and Walley, no bowls I'm afraid. Top toy of the day if you were posh was a Raleigh Grifter or Chopper I had neither. We bathed once a week on a Sunday whether we required it or not, if fortunate you had access to a shower which was in fact a rubber hose connected



to the tap with a shower head. Washing facilities for the remainder of the week consisted of being "topped and tailed" as required by an ever-attentive mother and a damp tea cloth; happy days indeed. Despite being a child we all tended to have jobs in those days, I was both a milk boy and paper boy, thinking nothing of getting up at 4 am every day to work for Cecil Norman for £12 a week. After finishing my milk round mam would have my tea and toast ready for 0630am before making my way to Silksworth to collect my morning papers all delivered by 0730. Back home another round of toast and off to school by 0815. At 4:30pm I would be back to collect my evening papers, all for £6 a week. Good money back then although I have to admit to leading a paper boy strike in 1977, demanding better pay. All the others promised to support me in my endeavours. In reality I was sacked, and the others crawled back. Arthur Scargill had nothing on me.

At the age of 11 I was fortunate enough to get into Bede secondary School which was regarded by many as a really good school which it was. I never missed a day, great teacher's great friends and so many fond memories. On leaving school in 1981 at the age of 16 I wrote to the council asking to be employed at a reasonable rate of pay to tidy up the grounds of our local church St Mathews, the place was a mess and even then, I was a keen gardener. To my surprise I received a letter back within the week offering me my first job on a YOS, Youth Opportunity Scheme on £24pw working as part of a small team producing a monthly newsletter called "New style" based at Houghton YOS centre. I was required with others to write articles and take photos of interesting aspects of our local area which was then edited published and handed out to the local community. A number of other jobs followed including working as a Veg cook with the NHS at Sunderland hospitals before I finally got a real job with the Ministry of Justice in June 1988, I was 23. I was keen to get started, I had met my wife to be Tracy (Daughter of Howard Smith) and we were keen to establish our roots and get married. After training I ended up in Chelmsford, Essex of all places, travelling home every other week to rejoin my family. Tracy and I were married in April 1991, despite Howards best efforts to put her off. Howard had visions of some well-heeled lawyer or Doctor walking her down the aisle rather than some kid from a council estate with nothing but dreams to offer. Tracy opted for dreams and the rest as they say is history. Many a winter evening when courting Tracy on returning from a night out in Finos night club I was required to sleep in Howard's old Volvo parked on the drive rather than being allowed on the couch, which was reserved for the dog. We had our first child Elliot in September 1990, with Oliver to follow in 1996 then finally Elizabeth in 2005. I managed to get posted home eventually in 1994 settling in Middle Herrington where we have remained ever since. My
