My Name is Edward Dinsdale ' Ned' to you people. I was born and bred in Penshaw in 1942 in a family of 7.4 sisters and 3 brothers. Sadly there is only 3 of us left. Myself, brother Robert and sister Laura.

At the age of 5 I started my school days at Penshaw School and at the age of 8 developed my love of football. I was a centre forward and scored that many goals I lost count. I left school aged 15 and started work at Herrington colliery on 15/4/57 until 1986 in which time I experienced three miners strikes 1971/72, 1974 and 1984 due to the Tory government. These were very bad days! I then transferred to Vane tempest colliery in Seaham in 1986 till all the mines were closed in 1992 by the Iron lady Maggie Thatcher (spit spit) and that was the end of my 35 year mining career. 34 years underground. I then got a temporary job 6 months of the year at South Shields as a gardener in the parks until I retired.

Getting back to my youth days, I met my late wife Rita when I was 17 years old at our local rock and roll dance hall held on Friday nights. Rita taught me to rock and roll but she was always the star turn at that, not me. We had some great nights there dressed as a teddy boy a few pints and off we went. Happy days. Rita and I were married in 1962 and had one daughter Jacqueline, the love of our lives. We had 51 years together before she sadly passed away in 2013 and we have so many happy memories of her.

I was involved in youth team football with 2 local teams. Herrington YMCA Youths and Herrington C.W Youths. Both teams had a lot of success over the many years something which I was so proud of.

I took up outdoor bowling in 1990 with Herrington WBC where we won the Davie Quinn pairs and CIU league.. I then moved to the local rivals which is now NHBC in 2015. The club started to struggle and was down to 12 members after the covid pandemic. Then by word of mouth members started to join. We never had ladies at the green until ' Girls aloud' turned up. A new committee was formed and the club has gone from strength to strength and I am so proud to be part of it... I look forward to my bowling days'If Selected'


