Harold Howey division 1 NHBC "B" finished 7th


NHBC "A" finished 10th

The Wick (or Herrington Glide) We learn a bit about Marie Graham Born 1951, second child of Mary and Bob Henderson. I have an older brother, Chris, who lives in Wales. (my mam and brother were both born on Xmas Day).

My dad was a chauffeur for Rolls Royce and my mam was a seamstress/alteration hand working at Liverpool House (a department store) in the town, Sunderland that is, not The Toon! My Mam was desperate to get me interested in sewing, knitting etc and follow in her footsteps and bought me things like children's knitting needles and a battery operated sewing machine for Xmas, however, the only thing I really wanted was a size 5 football!

I loved my childhood and that was mainly due to the fact I loved sport, (especially football,) and being outdoors. My mam was the eldest of 8 kids so I had lots of cousins to play with. One of those cousins was none other than Pat Gibson and I spent lots of time at their house in Leamside with her and Jeff, her younger brother. We spent hours playing all kinds of



sports or having "adventures" at Finchale Abbey. In fact we had our 'first job' at a farm through there doing 'Tattie picking'-child labour/ back breaking work, but it was a laugh and we got paid! (other jobs I have had include, Postwoman, Play leader, clerk in the office at Edward Thompson and working in the Mono Plastic cup Factory on the outskirts of Belmont)

I attended West Park secondary school (which later became Thornhill) and it was here where my sport really developed, in fact it was the only thing that did develop as I was useless at most other subjects (unlike Pat who was brainy, could play the piano AND she could SEW and KNIT! (I think my mam secretly wanted to adopt her!!) I played hockey, netball and tennis for the school teams and represented Durham County Schools in the javelin at Intermediate & Senior levels at The National Championships in Surrey. Another girl from Thorney Close school was also a decent javelin thrower and we had to have a 'throw off' to determine who would actually be the County representative at the Nationals. It was agreed between the respective PE teachers that this throw off would take place at Thorney. I met my PE teacher, as instructed, in the staff car park as she was giving me and my javelin a lift up to Thorney. What I didn't realise was that she didn't have a car and we were going on her Lambretta motor scooter! I travelled on the back of this scooter holding onto the back of her with one hand and my javelin with the other! No crash helmets in those days - we travelled like that from West Park school (which used to be next to Park Lane bus station) up to Thorney Close and back again! Imagine doing that these days with all the health and safety procedures in place! Around this time I had been seriously ill in hospital with glandular fever and most of my hair fell out, I was left almost bald

apart from a few wispy bits of hair around the sides - I looked like Friar Tuck, not what you want at 15 yr old!

I left school at 18, having gained enough GCE's to go to teacher training college to study PE. What a 3 years that was, we were

crazy, in fact I don't know how we managed to qualify, yet somehow we did and in 1973I got my first full time job teaching PE in South Tyneside - a good year was '73, first full time job, I met Peter and to top it all off, myself, Pat and other family members travelled to the old Wembley to see our beloved SAFC lift the FA Cup! In 1976, I married Peter, who I had met socially at South Shields Cricket club. He was a Washington lad whose friends at school were Bryan Ferry and Howard Kendall, they both went on to become famous, he ended up getting hitched to me! Haway now, who got the best deal there!!

Peter started his working life at 18 as a cricketer for Warwickshire, spending 3 years there. Unfortunately, his contract wasn't renewed so he came back to the North East where he worked on the IT side of things for North of England Building Society and later he trained as a junior school teacher.

He taught for a few years in South Shields but realised the kids were annoying and he only liked the school holidays, so he went back into IT! We have 2 children and 4 grandchildren who keep us on our toes! Many memories from my teaching career where you soon realise you're not just a teacher but a social worker, a substitute parent a disciplinarian and a shoulder to cry on! Ive been spat on, threatened, verbally and physically abused and pelted with snowballs, and that was just from the staff! But I stuck it out for 30+ years and there were more good times than bad.

One of the more unusual moments was when a parent of a Yr 11 girl made an appointment to see me. They came into my office where the mam announced ......."There's nee easy way to say this Mrs Graham so am just ganna come strite out with it, she's (pointing at her daughter) up the

duff! She telt'us they hadn't been deein it but a knew they had cos I could see carpet burns on their elbows and knees!!" How do you follow that up with a straight face!!

I was persuaded to join NHBC 3 years ago and I've thoroughly enjoyed learning a new sport at my age and that is all down to the members both on & off the rink.
