Welcome to this month's Captains Report. As you may already know our green is due to open on the 12 April so I'm sure we will have plenty of members having a roll up as soon as they can. Last season we tried our best to protect the green from wear and damage by playing on half rinks as well as full rinks and using the green protector sheets. We have purchased several more of these protector sheets and it is very important that they are used especially at the start of the season when the green is still very wet. The committee have decided that there will be 2 rinks that will have the protector mats down at all opening times initially, this will be reviewed as the season progresses. Last year there were a few rinks that were severely damaged and top dressing and seed had to be applied to reinstate the green to a playable state. Can I ask all members to be considerate and look after the green, if you feel you are damaging the green with the delivery of your woods then you need to make sure that a green protector sheet is put down if there is not one on your rink. Committee members who open the green will be monitoring the condition and the rinks being used to ensure that no damage is being done. I know we have a few members who struggle to deliver their woods to a full jack length when the green is wet, can I please ask that you are considerate to the other members who also play. The game is hard enough, having to pick the correct line to deliver your woods on but then to avoid divots on the rink makes it even harder or impossible at times. As soon as the green opens there will be opportunities for you to let me know which teams you would like to be

considered for and what in-house club competitions you want to enter. There will be several sheets left in the clubhouse, so you write your names on them. This year's pairs competitions will be named pairs as we did last year with the mixed pairs. This decision has been made to hurry the competitions on as I know it can be hard trying to arrange games where in some cases people don't know who they are playing with or playing against.

The Wick (or Herrington Glide) We learn a bit about Michael Galley



Born June 1962, 20 Jennifer Avenue, Castletown, a mining community where everyone knew everyone. Earliest memories; walking to school past the shops and the farm, the only sounds of an occasional car, or hum from the electric milk-float; first day at infants, being introduced to lifelong friend Graham playing behind the piano. We still speak regularly and meet annually for walking holidays with other childhood mates; several school terms in a Market Rasen school due to family circumstances. As kids prior to the A19, Wessington way and its industrial units being developed we had all kinds of fun, surrounded by playgrounds; the castle and dene; the black woods; all

along the riverside; the pit yards. We would: climb the sandbank cliffs; the castle walls; trees for egg collections; play chicken with coal trucks, and edge out over the river along the beams under the newly constructed Hylton bridge daring each other on. There were casualties sadly, 1 drown, several toes lost to a coal truck, countless broken arms and legs from swings and falls, but most escape unscathed.

Graduate to Castle View Comprehensive in 1973. I was part of a student exchange programme with an American school in Pennsylvania, living with an American family and attending high school for a month. A fabulous experience the families continue to this day with three generations of both families continuing to visit. Many hours spent at Hylton Castle Boys club running the gauntlet of the castle dene and Bunny Hill, a different kind of arena where reputations could be made or lost against the unwashed Redhouse hordes.

Start 3year Apprenticeship with the PWD as a Painter and Decorator in 1978. 1980 Enjoy my first 8 parachute jumps at Usworth Airfield. 1981 go to London for a couple of years then return. I had pestered a young lady for a phone number in the Dun Cow before heading south and we had kept in touch after I eventually found out her name (Lorraine) so returning North proved the right decision. After a couple of not so good years moving between different local employers, losing my only surviving sibling and one of my closest friends, things started to improve. 1988 married Lorraine and we purchased our first house which needed lots of work I decide to go self-employed!! The next couple of years were interesting and successful enabling me to fund further education courses in Building

Surveying and also teach apprentices at Bede Annexe. In 1991 our daughter Jessica was born. Start work at Sunderland Housing Group Technical Section.
